



STUDY QUESTIONS FOR **DECEMBER 29**

Series: *Even Better*

EVEN BETTER than Angels! (Hebrews 1:4-14)

Introduction

1. What does the Bible say about angels? Is it different from what you originally thought about angels?
2. Share the story if you ever seriously underestimated how good someone was at something (like playing an instrument, ping-pong, motocross racing ...).

Digging Deeper

3. Make 10 observations about **Hebrews 1:4-14**. What stands out to you?
4. **Read Psalm 2**. Who could the king be in verse 6? Is it more likely to be a human king, or a heavenly angel? What supports your choice in the text?
5. **Read Psalm 104:1-4**. How do you see Creation pointing our praise back to the Creator? And how does verse 4 fit what we read in Hebrews about angels?
6. **Read Psalm 45:6-7**. It's hard to explain the move from verse 6 (*Your throne, O God is forever*) to verse 7 (*therefore God, your God, has anointed you*) without the king of the psalm also being God! How can we *worship* Jesus as our King?
7. **Read Psalm 102:12-28**. What does this psalm offer us to fuel our prayers of praise to our God? How does it draw us today into its praise back then?
8. **Read Psalm 110:1-4**. When will this happen for Jesus? How do we see Him ruling today—and how will we see Jesus rule in the future?
9. What did you hear in the message this Sunday that stood out to you? Is there anything you would emphasize, add, or change?

Application

10. What makes Jesus so different from the angels? What mistakes will we stumble into if we treat Jesus like an angel, or angels like Jesus?
11. How have these passages renewed your praise of God the Son? What's different about these praises of Jesus that you can dwell on and include in your praise of Him moving forward?
